POLICY: Senior high school students may enroll in adult education courses when they have received prior approval from their school counselor or designee and demonstrate a need for academic remediation or completion of high school credit deficiencies.

MAJOR CHANGES: This Bulletin replaces Bulletin No. M-4, titled Equivalent Academic Courses in Adult Education for Senior High School Diploma Credit, dated May 21, 2001. The information and forms have been revised to reflect current District policies and procedures. Courses have been aligned to the California State Content Standards. Changes reflected in this bulletin become effective with summer school/intersession courses and fall courses taken beginning July 2005 and thereafter.

GUIDELINES: The following guidelines apply.

I. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this bulletin is to provide procedures for uniformly granting approval to students to take adult education courses and to equitably assign credit for equivalent adult education courses.

Under special circumstances, senior high school students may attend classes intended primarily for adults. According to Section 52500 of the Education Code: “Adult schools and evening senior high schools shall consist of classes for adults. Minors may be admitted to those classes pursuant to Board policy.” Senior high school students may enroll in adult education courses when they have received prior approval from their school counselor or designee and demonstrate a need for academic remediation or completion of high school credit deficiencies.

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II. ENROLLMENT CRITERIA AND EQUIVALENT COURSES

In order to ensure equivalent instructional opportunities, enrollment in any Division of Adult and Career Education course is contingent upon student performance at the language arts and math skill level of the course prerequisites or approval of the Senior High School Counselor and the Adult School Counselor. The approved Division of Adult and Career Education testing instrument(s) assesses the skill-level performance. Enrollment in any Division of Adult and Career Education course will be based on the assessment(s). Concurrently enrolled senior high school students will be placed into the appropriate course that reflects the skill level determined by the assessment.

This bulletin designates the academic courses most commonly offered in the adult schools and employment preparation centers, which are approved for senior-high-school aged youth and are deemed to be equivalent to the corresponding senior high school courses. These equivalencies were established after extensive evaluation by instructional staff from the Division of Instructional Services and the Division of Adult and Career Education. Senior high school courses not listed in this bulletin have no adult education course equivalencies.
